Inaugural 5k in memory of Frank Romano huge success

GOSHEN — The Inaugural Frank J. Romano Rock N' Run 5k, held on Sunday at Goshen High School, attracted runners from all over the region.

Nick Kealy, who traveled to the race with members of the Kittatinny High School Cross Country Team, from Sussex County, N.J., was the champion completing the hilly circuit five-kilometer course In 17:47.

"I liked the course and it was awesome to win first place," said the senior from Layton, N.I.

Until this year, Kealy spent his falls playing soccer but converted over to crosscountry for the 2010 season.

Gregory Foster of Goshen was second, running 17:54, and Kealy's teammate, sophomore Mark Stark, was third in 17:57.

In the women's race, the champion was Erin Ballard, who came to Goshen from Boston to run. She swept the women's field turning in a time of 19:04.

The event benefited the Frank J. Romano Foundation and the memory of a civic-minded man. Romano's daughters — Carolyn Romano, Amy Byers, Kelly Jeffers, and Dina Prosser — started the foundation to honor their father's lifelong dedication to public service and to continue his legacy of charitable work. He was councilman, then supervisor, on the Goshen Town Board, and before that served on the Village of Goshen's Zoning Board of Appeals. He also did volunteer work with the Italian-American Club. Romano died on July 17, 2007, at the age of 66.

"Our dad lived fully immersed in the belief that anything was possible and that we could do anything," said his daughter and the foundation's president, Carolyn Romano.

She recalled how he once fished her keys

out from behind the Goshen High School lockers.

"I had to call him and tell him what had happened," she said. "The lockers had this slant so my friend was throwing the keys up and catching them as they slid down. I knew there was a slight gap, and that's where the keys of course ended up falling. My dad arrived with a fishing pole and proceeded to fish them out. He never doubted that he'd retrieve them."

Following the marquis event and the awards ceremony, there were kids races which saw three events: the three-year-olds, the five-year-olds and the six- and seven-year-olds. The race directors put each group through some stretches, and then races of varying lengths based on age were run down the high school track.
